## “3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Safe Schools Conference” School Emergency Triage Training (SETT) for School Nurses

Effective management of school emergencies with mass casualties requires careful training, preparation, and planning to maximize effectiveness under less than optimal conditions. The first part of the training will be the SETT program for school nurses, developed by the National Association of School Nurses (NASN), which provides school nurses with the knowledge, skills, and resources to perform as leaders of First-Aid teams in response to mass casualty events in schools. The last part of the training will provide school nurses with the knowledge and resources on how the school nurse and emergency preparedness fit into the Safe School Plan requirement for California schools.

This special one-day training will focus on School Emergency Triage Training (SETT) and Safe School Planning for School Nurses. Total contact hours: 6 \* (Total contact hours for attending entire conference is 12 hours.)
