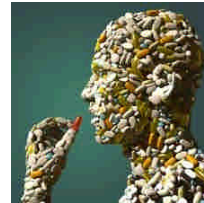

The “Adolescent Subcultures and Current Drug Trends” presentation is the most sought after presentation from Orange County covering the most up-to-date trends involving adolescents. This training has been presented across the nation at conferences, schools, businesses, and community centers to other law enforcement agencies, educators, non-profit groups, health care professionals, and parents.

The presentation comes with a “Road Show” that contains drugs, paraphernalia, weapons, storage containers, and other miscellaneous items that have been confiscated from students at local schools. The presentation was made possible by the on-going relationship of OCSD’s School Resource Officers and the schools they serve.

Deputy Lance Christensen – Orange County Sheriff’s Department

Deputy Lance Christensen is a 16 year veteran of the Orange County Sheriff’s Department. Deputy Christensen has spent the 9 years in patrol and is currently assigned to South Operations as the School Resource Officer for Tesoro High School in Las Flores.

Prior to transferring to patrol, Deputy Christensen worked in Corrections at the James Musick Facility, Central Men’s Jail, and Intake Release Center. While assigned to Corrections, he was selected as an Assistant Project Manager overseeing large public works contracts including the Sheriff’s Tactical Range, Nabisco Evidence Property Building, Peace Officer’s Memorial, James A. Musick Construction Technology and Visiting Buildings, James A. Musick Substation Expansion planning, and Aliso Viejo Sheriff’s Station.

Deputy Christensen is a Field Training Officer. He is a current member of CIRT (Critical Incident Response Team), the Bike Patrol team, and a Terrorism Liaison Officer. Deputy Christensen is a Drug Awareness Recognition (DAR) Expert and teaches a Law Enforcement class for high school students through the Laguna-Capistrano Regional Occupational Program.

Deputy Christensen has traveled all over the United States as an expert speaker on At Risk Youth, Juvenile Law, and Current Drug and Social Trends. He has been a guest speaker at local schools, non-profit organizations, political arenas, national conferences, and government agencies. Because of Deputy Christensen’s dedication to the students he serves in the school district, he was selected as California School Resource Officer of the Year for 2009-2010 through the California School Resource Officer’s Association.

Sergeant Nancy Wilkey – Orange County Sheriff’s Department

Sergeant Nancy Wilkey is a 22 year veteran of the Orange County Sheriff’s Department. She is currently assigned to the Aliso Viejo Sheriff’s Station, South Investigations / Juvenile Services Bureau. She supervises the investigators assigned to investigate juvenile crimes in Sheriff’s jurisdiction, manages the School Resource Officer program, and is the liaison between the Orange County Sheriff’s Department and local school districts.

During her time as a Deputy Sheriff, Sergeant Wilkey was assigned to Corrections at the Intake Release Center. She was transferred to the Professional Standards Division as a Recruiter and worked background investigations. In 1995, Sergeant Wilkey transferred to patrol where she served the citizens of Laguna Hills and Aliso Viejo. She was a Field Training Officer and Hostage Negotiator.

When Sergeant Wilkey promoted to sergeant, she was assigned to the Central Women’s Jail. After one year, she transferred to the city of San Clemente as a patrol sergeant. In 2004, Sergeant Wilkey was assigned to the Training Division as the Firearms Training Sergeant. In 2005, she was reassigned to the City of San Clemente as the Administrative Sergeant where she worked for 5 years until she transferred to South Investigations.

Sergeant Wilkey is a Facilitator for the Parent Project, a class for parents with “out of control” adolescents. She is a member of GRIP (Gang Reduction and Intervention Partnership) and works collaboratively with the District Attorney’s Office and Probation Department to keep young kids out of gangs through a series of meetings, presentations, and incentive programs at the local schools. Sergeant Wilkey has her Bachelor’s Degree in Criminal Justice and her Master’s Degree in Psychology. She is also a graduate of the Sherman Block Supervisory Leadership Institute.
